## History

The Dart Foundation is a private family foundation established in 1984 by William A. and Claire T. Dart. Founded in Mason, Michigan, the Dart Foundation continues to be headquartered there. Because of this, the mid-Michigan area has long been a focal point of Dart Foundation philanthropy. Each year grants are awarded in other areas of the United States and a select number of national and international grants are made.

## Mission

Historically, it has been the Dart Foundation's preference to make grants in support of youth education programs (primarily science, technology, engineering and mathematics). Other areas of interest have included health, community services and journalism programs that focus on the accuracy of news reporting on scientific and environmental issues.

## *We Note the Passing of the Dart Foundation's Chairman*

William A. Dart, Founder and Chairman of Dart Container Corporation and Board Chairman of the Dart Foundation, passed away on December 2, 2011 at the age of 84. "WA" as he was called, was born in Mason, Michigan, a small town located just south of Lansing. After serving in the U. S. Navy as a radar technician during World War II, he graduated from the University of Michigan with degrees in mathematics, metallurgy and chemical engineering. After working for DuPont Chemical for about a year, he returned to Mason in 1951 to join his father, William F. Dart, in the family business which, at that time, was manufacturing metal products. He saw the potential in plastic materials, and he and his father gradually switched their focus from metal to plastic, focusing on foam cups. They shipped their first order of foam cups in 1960.

Two of WA's sons have grown up in the family owned business. Ken, Dart's President, joined the company in 1975, and his brother Bob, Chief Executive Officer, followed him five years later. Bob assumed the responsibility for the daily operation of the company in 1993. The company recently celebrated its 50th anniversary, a milestone that WA was both proud of and humbled by.

In 2010 the Dart family dedicated a Tribute Garden to honor employees who have contributed to Dart Container's success.

# Dart Foundation Grants by Category

## Fiscal Year 2011

Prospective grantees may request guidelines for submitting a grant application by contacting the Dart Foundation. Grants can be made toward specific projects or programs, capital needs, or general operations. Grants involving collaboration between organizations are encouraged. The Dart Foundation sometimes requires matching gifts to be raised. Larger grants are usually made over a multi-year period. The Dart Foundation does not make grants to individuals.

## A Focus on S.T.E.M.

According to a recent study of 15-year-olds in the 30 most technologically advanced and wealthiest nations in the world, the United States ranked 21st in science literacy and 25th in math proficiency. Yet workforce projections made by the US Department of labor for 2014 show that 15 of the 20 fastest growing occupations require significant science and math training to successfully compete for a job.

Since its inception, the Dart Foundation has focused on supporting science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) programs for youth. In this Annual Report we have featured some of the STEM grants made by the Dart Foundation in Fiscal Year 2011.

# A Glimpse at Four 2011 Grants

## Science

*Crispus Attucks Community Center, Lancaster, PA*

For the past three years, the Dart Foundation has sponsored summer science camp at Crispus Attucks Community Center in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. This eight-week, full-day camp provides hands-on science experiments, wellness education, and field trips to low-income youth. Crispus Attucks was founded in 1927 as a center for the African-American community, celebrating its heritage with historical, cultural, educational and recreational programs.

## Technology

*Southmont Elementary School, Asheboro, NC*

## Engineering

## Mathematics

*Ingham Intermediate School District, Lansing, MI*

2011 marked the Dart Foundation's 25th year of continuous support for CHAMP (Cooperative Highly Accelerated Math Program) and MASCOT (Mathematics Augmentation Series: Cultivating Optimum Teaching), which have provided advanced mathematics classes for thousands of students in mid-Michigan. CHAMP, offered in conjunction with Michigan State University, allows high school students to complete four years of math in two years. The MASCOT program is advanced math offered to middle schoolers.
